# **GM** Report

My name is Sean Maloney and I have been given the incredible opportunity to serve as the Chi Chapter Grand Master during the fall of 2019. The pressures of additional classes and preparations for law school have made it necessary for me to hand over the Grand Master duties for the spring semester to brother Tyler Fink.

A little bit of information about myself: I am a Junior studying General Management in the Krannert School of Management with a minor in Philosophy and Political Science with the goal of going to law school and becoming a commercial litigator. As a freshman, I could immediately gather from friends and new people on campus that Kappa Sigma was a prestigious fraternity. After the first 30 minutes of my first rush event at 308 North Street and listening to all the brothers talk about how special this house and brotherhood is, I knew this was where I wanted my home to be for the next four years. This house has helped mold me into the man I am today, given me friendships that will last a lifetime, and shown me how to live by the Star and Crescent every day.

To begin with, this summer 6 brothers, including myself, traveled to the 150th Sesquicentennial Anniversary Grand Conclave in Charlottesville, Virginia. It was an incredible experience to be immersed in all of the history of Kappa Sigma and to see the dorm room at 46 East Lawn where our Five Friends and Brothers founded this remarkable fraternity. While at Grand Conclave, Chi was awarded the Largest Chapter on Campus award. Our main goal this year is to come together as a house and win multiple national awards including the FACE award.

As a chapter, we have already been working diligently this first semester and have done many noteworthy things that display how incredible this house is and how strong our brotherhood is. Our main focuses are to improve our house GPA to compete for a top spot among all of the 42 fraternities on campus, raise more philanthropy dollars and community service hours than ever before, increase campus leadership positions and earn 100% on ritual proficiency throughout the house.

The chapter's closer interaction with the University began this fall with dinners and discussions with Dr.

Katie Sermersheim, Associate Vice-Provost and Dean of Students, and Brandon Cutler, Associate Dean of Students. Brother Mike Cline, Chi's faculty adviser and Purdue Senior Vice President, is also a regular visitor to the house.

Along with our philanthropic, academic, and intramural activities, the chapter has excelled in campus involvement. Brothers are members and involved in the Old Master's Program, Civil Engineering Student Advisory Council, Purdue Engineering Student Council, Purdue THINK, Interfraternity Council, College Mentors for Kids, Pharmacy Club, National Electrical Construction Association, and many more. Chi also continues to win multiple championships in intramurals and plans on winning many more throughout the year.

On the philanthropic and community service side, Chi has, so far, hosted a Spike Ball tournament, a Pumpkin carving contest, sold hot chocolate, and is preparing for our annual Yuletide event which will also double as a food drive. Our biggest accomplishment so far this year has been rising over \$4,000 in one day in support of our brother, Tommy Lenskold, who will be competing in Zeta's Big Man on Campus competition for the second year in a row. All proceeds from this event go to funding research for breast cancer.

This past September the chapter participated in the Mega Reunion for the brothers of the '60s. We had the privilege of meeting some incredible brothers. Their stories about Chi back in the day; what they have accomplished in their lives since Purdue; the bond of brotherhood that lasts forever; and their advice for living a productive life were truly impressive and inspiring.

As a chapter, we have many exciting events planned for the second semester including a phenomenal spring rush, the culmination of the Big Man on Campus competition, Mom's day, an Easter egg themed philanthropy event, Grand Prix, and the annual Man of the Year dinner and many more fun activities.

It has been two years since our last Agitator. The chapter alumni leaders and chapter officers are committed to rectifying this with 2 full Agitators Issues per year from now on along with regular updates issues.

The House Corporation has made several significant additions and changes to the services provided to the chapter. A live-in House Mother, an outside accounting firm, a regular cleaning/maintenance service and other professional support vendors have been added.

Ms. Teri Battleday started as the chapter's live-in House Mother (House Director) on August 12, 2019. Three of the single rooms on the first floor were converted into a House Mother's Suite this past summer. Times have changed. Currently, 15 of Purdue's 42 fraternities have House Mothers.

Bill Humphrey, Greek Life Services, has been engaged to provide an independent accounting service for the Chi House Corporation financial activities. Omni Services began cleaning the common areas of the chapter house every Tuesday last year. Omni Services also does regular inspections of the house and provides prompt repairs when needed. With a new chef and menu process, College Chefs is now in its 7th year providing food service for the chapter.

We welcome back Robert Morris '00 who was recently reappointed as Chi's Alumni Adviser. Robert has extensive experience as a past Chi Alumni Adviser and DGM for Chi's District. Most of Robert's AAA's have graduated within the past 5-10 years. Other alumni support will continue to be provided by all of the dedicated alumni on other boards. A special thanks to Bob Sorensen '60, "who wants no official title", but who continues visiting house at least once a week and provides other "services" to the Alumni Boards.

Michael Cline '84, Purdue Senior Vice President, is continuing as Chi's Faculty Adviser. Mike has been a great help to the chapter and alumni groups as an example and mentor.

Besides leading the efforts to increase the funding and scholarship support provided by the Education Foundation, Steve Springer '67 has been very helpful providing legal "suggestions" to the chapter and alumni. Normal chapter house wear and tear is beginning to show in spite of reasonable maintenance and upgrading efforts over the 19 years since Chi was remodeled and expanded. The general condition of the house is still very good, but it is now realistic and necessary to start thinking about upgrades and renovations to continue to make the house competitive with the recent renovations or construction by other large fraternities on campus.

Maintaining reasonable house occupancy for the past several years has continued to be difficult due to outside forces and changing student attitudes. Several large, relatively luxurious apartment buildings have opened near the house over the past 2 years. Also, a common problem for all Greek organizations is the new trend that "members want to live out their senior year". As a result, recent house occupancy has been well below the modified occupancy of 74 resulting from the use of study rooms for "Chill Rooms", a Store Room, a Dedicated Study Room and the House Mother's Suit.

In spite of low occupancy, the House Corporation's finances remain reasonably healthy. However, the financial impacts due to the recent low occupancy and small pledge classes will seriously impact the house corporation's future operating budgets and capital reserves.

## Frank Caputo '66


