# President & Founder of Pritchett Realty Corp

Brother Pritchett graduated from Purdue University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering Sciences in 1964. He continued his education earning a Master of Business Administration from Harvard University in 1966. Mike grew up in Hammond and graduated from Hammond High School. While at Purdue, Mike was active in student activities. He was elected President of both his Freshman and Sophomore class.

During his sophomore year Mike ran an unsuccessful campaign to be Student Body Government Vice President for his Junior year. He continued to participate in student activities by serving as the Chairman of the Interfraternity Council Judicial Board during his senior year.

Mike began his business career in commercial banking and then the real estate finance industry as a mortgage banker, specializing in loans and joint venture financing for commercial and industrial properties. In 1980, Mike followed his entrepreneurial spirit and founded Pritchett Realty Corporation, which has developed, owned, leased, and managed several office buildings in the part of Chicago's western suburbs known as the East-West Corridor. These buildings have proven to be good long-term investments.

Mike's favorite part of his business was real estate development, which gave him the opportunity to start with the vacant ground, and then conceive, finance, construct, and lease office buildings that will be at their locations for decades. He is pleased that his firm's developments continue to contribute positively to their communities.

and Rush member and for his dedication and hard work, won the Kappa Sigma Scholarship Leadership award. He was also a Purdue Grand Prix driver and a varsity grappler.

After graduating, Steven began his career, which would soon see many accomplishments. Mr. Funk is now a patron of TED, a Special Envoy to British Columbia's film industry, and a founding Financier and Director of Unitus Capital, just to name a few. Additionally, he is a developer of the Refuge Air Ranch and founded Aspen Properties. He also served on the Innovations Board of X-Prize Foundation, was the former owner and chair of Imperial Parking, and co-founded the UP Conference and UP Partners Fund, investing in aerial mobility and transport.

After earning a degree in liberal arts in 2004, Vince began his career as an educator before jumping into the insurance industry. Currently, Vince is a commercial insurance producer for the Mitchell Agency, an independent property and casualty insurance agency that has been serving clients throughout Indiana and the Midwest since 1885.

Although enjoying post-graduate life, the Chi chapter was able to successfully call back Vince in 2020. Vince became the alumni advisor for the chapter, a position he still holds today. For routinely going above and beyond, Vince was awarded both the Outstanding First Year Volunteer Award and the Outstanding Alumnus Advisor Award from Purdue in 2021. Additionally, he was nominated for Alumni Advisor of the Year from Purdue Fraternity, Sorority, and Cooperative Living, a division of the Office of the Dean of Students for the past school year.

Additionally, Vince is a Board Member of the Almost Home Humane Society, which serves more than 3,000 pets each year in Tippecanoe County, and is a volunteer and coach for the Greater Lafayette Regional Soccer Alliance.

As for what Kappa Sigma means to him and some advice for undergraduates, Vince had the following to say "From the first time that brother Conrad Hammond asked me if I would like to help start a fraternity, I have tried to the best of my ability to embody what it means to be a Kappa Sigma member.
