### GRAND MASTER REPORT

My name is Kevin Boes, and I am grateful to have served as the Grand Master for the Chi Chapter of Kappa Sigma at Purdue University during the 2020-2021 academic year and to be chosen to be the 2021-2022 Grand Master. Some of the following is an update and summary of details contained in my November, 2020 Agitator report.

The chapter appeared before virtual disciplinary hearings with both the SEC and Purdue's IFC during May, 2020. During the SEC Show Cause Hearing, Worthy Grand Master Brother Justin Hansen imposed a significant fine, required a Chapter Alumni Board of Control and challenged the undergraduate brothers to turn Chi back to the fraternity's highest standard as a F.A.C.E Chapter within just 1 year. With the assistance of our faculty adviser, Mike Cline, reasonable IFC/University probations and restrictions were agreed separately for the chapter. The Chapter was very lucky to be given the opportunity to operate after the mistakes made.

Chi never backs away from a challenge. I am happy to report that in just 10 months; despite COVID-19 sanctions and restrictions and with strong Alumni support, the undergraduate brothers have upheld Chi Chapter's 135-year Chi traditions and legacy. Chi was Purdue University's Top 20-21 Recruiting Chapter and is once again regarded as one of the top houses on campus. There is a strong possibility that Chi will receive the F.A.C.E. award at this summer's Conclave.

After last summer's strict membership review conducted by our new Alumni Board of Control (ABC), the remaining chapter membership was effectively cut in half retaining only the brothers who demonstrated a positive commitment to Kappa Sigma's values, ideals and practices and also a

desire to actively participate in house and campus activities. With this new focus, the Chapter has seen dramatic changes during the past academic year in its culture, performance, achievements and overall commitment to the standards of Kappa Sigma. The ABC has been instrumental in turning Chi around, whether it be advising,

speaking on behalf of the Chapter, or testing for Ritual Proficiency. Special thanks to our new Alumni Advisor, Vince Shissler, who has committed countless hours towards helping rebuild the Chapter. From this point on, the Chapter will not look back.

Despite a smaller membership at the start of the school year, the eagerness to improve was apparent and demonstrated by the fall and spring rush efforts. Brothers Walt Foster and Caleb Mayhorn rallied a rush committee and the whole house to pledge-in, teach and initiate 33 fall and 20 spring qualified young men safely and effectively. Through a revamped Brothers in Action program, these men were molded, using the chapter's new culture, into brothers who positively represent the 4 pillars of Kappa Sigma. The new program was a success boasting an impressive 97% pledge retention rate. Some of the main achievements this year include:

- Becoming the Top 20-21 Recruiting Chapter at Purdue University,
- The chapter paid the \$25,000.00 SEC fine,
- Zero Protect Purdue Violations
- Doubled the overall member ritual proficiency percentage
- Raised over \$7,700.00 during the Stephan Alonzo Jackson weekend of giving
- 27 brothers donated blood during spring blood drive
- 90% membership participation in a 5K in memory of our house mother's son
- 90% chapter attendance at 3 collaborative IFC workshops
- Cut HQ liability insurance in half

Last summer, I was afraid for the future, as I thought changing Chi was too great a feat to accomplish. However, if I have been taught anything through it all, it's that tough times don't always last, but tough people do. It is safe to say that we, the Chi undergraduates and Alumni, are resilient. Some of the past mistakes that Chi Chapter made are still with us. The journey to again be an elite chapter is not over. But I fully believe that Chi Chapter has turned itself around for the better and does not plan to ever fall back on any of its negative, past mistakes. Guided by our watch words, diligence and

commitment, we will continue our journey toward becoming the top chapter at Purdue and within Kappa Sigma!

# Bob Sorenson '60 joins Chapter Celestial

Brother Sorensen was an exceptional example of what it means to be a Kappa Sigma Brother. During Bob's lifetime, he served, off and on, for 60 years as the chapter alumni adviser, district grand master, Chi House Corporation Board Member, Chi Alumni Association Board Member and reorganization trustee for another Indiana chapter. Bob was always available to assist with any chapter or fraternity need. Robert S. (Bob) Sorensen passed away on April 19, 2021. He was born on April 13, 1941 in Stoughton, Wisconsin. Bob grew up in Oak Park, Illinois before moving to West Lafayette in 1957, graduated from West Lafayette High School in 1959 and lived in West Lafayette ever since. Bob spent one year at Northwester U and then earned a B.S. in Industrial Management, M.S. in Industrial

Administration, and Ph. D. from Purdue University, in addition to a M.B.A. from Northwestern University. Bob was initiated into Kappa Sigma at Northwester before transferring to Purdue and Chi Chapter.

On June 20, 1964, Bob married Linda Markins, a Purdue Kappa Alpha Theta, of Gaston, Indiana and she survives. He is also survived by siblings, John, and Marilyn Sorensen Pratt (Thomas), son Scott of Indianapolis, and daughter Anne (Andrew) of Middleton, Wisconsin. Grandchildren are Sydney, Robert and Erik Sorensen and Sam, Alec, and Ryan Inman.

Bob deeply appreciated his Norwegian heritage and its emphasis on family, music, and education. He traveled to Norway many times, sometimes with other chi brothers, enjoying cherished relationships with Norwegian family and friends.

Bob began his career with the Ross Gear Division of TRW, Inc., and moved into higher education administration at Purdue in 1966. He left Purdue in 1984 while serving as Comptroller. After serving briefly as Associate Vice-President and Treasurer at St. Louis University he returned to West Lafayette to join the

staff of Ivy Tech Community College. He provided business and computing leadership for the local campus before serving as the Chief Information Officer for the college. After his retirement from Ivy Tech in 2006 he taught accounting in the Krannert School of Management at Purdue.

Lifetime priorities for Bob were his children, grandchildren, and extended family, as well as volunteer service to others. Earning the rank of Eagle Scout as a youth provided him a value base and an obligation to provide duty to others that framed his outlook on life. Locally he served in leadership positions with Tippecanoe Schools Foundation, Leadership Lafayette, Tippecanoe Arts Federation, Tippecanoe County Historical Association, Museums at Prophetstown, St. Andrew United Methodist Church, Sagamore Council Boy Scouts of America,

University Place Foundation, the Barbara Cook Chapter of Mortar Board, and the Kappa Sigma Fraternity. Beyond the local community, he held leadership positions at Kappa Sigma, at the Area and Regional levels of the Boy Scouts of America, Scientech Club of Indianapolis, Circle City Lodge of the Sons of Norway, Mortar Board National Foundation, and State and Regional professional associations. For the higher education community, he served on accreditation teams for the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association and the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

Bob's significant recognitions included the G.A. Ross Award for Outstanding Senior Man at Purdue in 1963, Sagamore of the Wabash awarded by Gov. O'Bannon in 1997, and the Daniel D. Robinson Award for Outstanding Contributions to the field of college and university accounting in 1995. Other recognitions were Mortar Board Distinguished Lifetime Service Award in 2016, the Lafayette YWCA Foundation Win Hentschel Distinguished Service Award in 2014, and the Boy Scout Silver Beaver and Silver Antelope awards.

# HOUSE CORP, ALUMNI ASSOCIATION AND ALUMNI ADVISER REPORT

Last November, we reported on a variety of chapter and facility changes due to fraternity and university disciplinary actions that impacted the functions of the chapter and operations of the house corporation. These changes were exacerbated by COVID-19 restrictions and practices. Now that the 2020-2021 school year is over, we are pleased to report that the chapter has survived the pandemic and experienced a complete turnaround in every way exceeding the expectations of the fraternity, the university and the alumni leadership.

As a quick summary: The chapter leadership and membership, working with the Alumni Board of Control (ABC), are now functioning at and above expectations; And the chapter's participation in occupancy numbers for next year and positive maintenance of the chapter house this year is "back to the old House Corporation expectations"; The October 8, 2021 135th Anniversary-Man of the Year Celebration is expected to be a great way to recognize Chi's return to prominence.

Sanctions and restrictions placed on the chapter were the consequence of unacceptable trends in the chapter membership's "activities, attitudes and results" over the past several years. The strong commitment of the new chapter leadership and membership mentored by the ABC has returned Chi to its former place of excellence and leadership in the order and on campus. We are proud to report that discussions with the fraternity's and campus leaderships and the relaxing of restrictions on the chapter are a gratifying result of the Chapter's efforts this past school year.

Pledging and initiating 53 new members (the most on Purdue's campus), paying the SEC's \$25,000.00 fine, participating in a significant number of fraternity and campus activities and working to get back in the lead academically are just a few of this year's milestones. Reducing individual insurance rates and the "possibility" for removing

any remaining Kappa Sigma and Purdue sanctions for next year are also significant milestones. We are also very proud that, among his other campus activities, the Chi's GM was elected to Purdue's Mortar Board honorary and is now its Secretary and Treasurer.

A compromise was reached with the chapter to accept a special assessment to cover the difference between the 61 fall live-in house contracts for next year and the minimum house occupancy of 75. Based on the limited chapter house damages and maintenance this past school year, this will satisfy the house corporation's financial budgets for the 2021-2022 school year. A strong commitment to fall rush has already begun. The expectations that the chapter will meet the 75 full house occupancy for the 2022-2023 school year seem very reasonable.

We are excitedly looking forward to "everything good" that will result going forward with the new operating and communicating synergy between the Chapter Executive Committee, chapter Membership, ABC and other Alumni Groups that began this past year.

### 2021 Hall of Fame Inductees

#### **WALT EVERSMAN'56**



Walt graduated Purdue in 1959 with a BS in Aeronautical Engineering. He completed an MS in Engineering Mechanics and a PhD in Aeronautics and Astronautics at

Stanford University while he was working for the Lockheed Missiles and Space Company. Walt's academic career started in 1964 as an Associate Professor of Aeronautical Engineering at Wichita State University. After ten years at WSU, he taught in New Zealand before returning to the US in 1978. Here he became the Chair of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering at Missouri University of Science and Technology. In 1985, he accepted appointment as Curators' Professor of Aerospace Engineering, the position from which he retired in 2015. Walt's academic interests include aircraft structural dynamics and design, while his research primarily covered aeroelasticity and aeroacoustics. Mr. Eversman is also a recipient of the 2008 AIAA Aeroacoustics Award.

#### DAVID DANNER'67



David graduated from Purdue in 1970 with a degree in BSIE and MSIE. He served his country in the Marine Corps for two years, going on to develop custom software and

hardware for his own company, IDEAMATICS, in 1975. To this day, Dr. Danner brings over 50 years of experience to the operations of IDEAMATICS as Chairman of the Board, President and Consulting Software Engineer. In 1986, he founded IDEATECH, Inc., to manufacture and distribute his invention. the Ideal-Phone product. This integrated the personal computer and the telephone into a single efficient workstation. Prior to this list of accomplishments, David had the opportunity to pledge for the Chi Chapter of Kappa Sigma (1967). He served as the chapter's house manager for two years and was the campaign manager for Brother Steve Springer's successful election as Sophomore Class President. David is extremely grateful for the friendships and confidence he has gained from the Chi Chapter. His wife, Pamela, is a little sister of the Chi Chapter. They have three daughters together, the oldest being a Purdue graduate (and her husband is a Kappa Sig!).


#### **KEVIN LICHTERMAN '01**



### Some history highlights

- Chi Chapter is founded on March 15, 1885 under the guidance of W.G.M. Stephen Alonzo Jackson. It is the 22nd Chapter of Kappa Sigma and the second fraternity established on the Purdue campus.
- Shortly after it's founding the Chi Chapter took up residence in a home at 40 North Salisbury Street. The structure remains to this day.
- The chapter opens the house at 308 North Street in time for 1922-23 school year.
- The chapter thrives during the years following World War II. The western addition is added to the house in 1961.
- After years of wear and tear on the facility and a declining membership, the Chi Chapter becomes dormant in 1995.
- After a successful Capital Campaign, the chapter house was expanded and completely rebuilt to its existing size.
- After increased interest from undergraduates at Purdue, the Chi Chapter is revived as a Colony in the fall of the 1999-2000 school year.
- After successfully meeting the requirements for initiation, the "Founding Fathers" of the new era of Chi are initiated in January of 2000.
- The house is painstakingly refurbished and rebuilt during the 2000-2001 school year and summer.
- After refocusing efforts during the pandemic of 2020, Chi is looking forward to a future as a leading chapter on the Purdue campus.
